The Annual Competition for the Glasgow Golf Union Strokeplay Championship will take place on Sunday 8th August 2010, under strokeplay conditions and in accordance with the Rules of Golf and the Local Rules of the Club and the Glasgow Golf Union, over 36 holes on the course of Williamwood Golf Club.

In the event of a tie for the Championship, a play-off will take place over the same course on a date to be arranged by the Executive of Glasgow Golf Union.

The Executive reserves the right to refuse any application and has authority to settle any dispute. Applications for entry forms to be sent by post must be accompanied by a stamped addressed envelope. Notification will be sent to every competitor advising him of his starting time..

This notification will allow the competitor to have the privileges of the Clubhouse and Course during the Championship.

Entry is restricted to players who have a handicap of 6 strokes or less, and whose nominated 'Home Club' is affiliated, as a Course Owning Club, to the Glasgow Golf Union.

The number of entrants is limited to 64 and, in the event of that number of entries being exceeded, the higher handicaps will be balloted.

Club Team Competition

In addition to the Individual event there will be a competition for Club Teams consisting of 3 previously nominated players representing their 'home club', the lowest four round aggregate scratch score (best two out of the three morning and best two out of the three afternoon rounds) counting for each Team. In the event of a tie, the best single final round, the best two final rounds, etc of each team will decide the winners. The winning team will go forward to the national stages of the competition. Team players are automatically included in the Individual event but should be listed on the team entry form.

Competitors are expected to observe the Club Rules regarding dress on the course and in the clubhouse at all times.

Practice round facilities are not available nor are caddies permitted

The use of electronic devices is only permitted for the measurement of distance.
